#### <u>CHAIR'S ADDRESS</u> from Joseph D. Ackerson, Ph.D.

To start my first ABEP Newsletter as Chair of the Board, I want to thank the professionals who have given their time and talents to serve on the Board. Prior Chairs, Dr. Pam Snider and Mr. Joe Taylor, have proved great exemplars of leadership and dedication, as well as professional congeniality. Current members, Drs. Mary Bowers, Marty Rohling, Carol Walker, and La'Shonda Moore, along with Board Attorney Matt Beam, Executive Director Lori Rall, and Administrative Assistant Joya Burge are very valuable team members who consistently go above and beyond the call of duty with their dedication to serving the public and ensuring due process to both applicants and licensed I also psychologists and psychological technicians. welcome our newest members, Drs. Kristin Tubre and Catalina Arata, and Ms. Kristi Miller, with profound gratitude and enthusiasm; I know the current Board members do similarly. I assure you that your Board members, staff, and attorney work very hard to fulfill their duties.

As a brain injury specialist, I am sure that for many of my patients I am the last person they want to see

professionally. I understand that: who in the world wants to have to deal with a concussion or more serious brain injury? But if you have one, you want to make sure you are receiving professional care from someone committed to their craft and will treat you with sensitivity and respect.

In a similar vein, no psychologist or psychological technician wants to have to deal with the Board due to an ethics or consumer complaint filed against them. Yet the reality is that we are seeing a trend of increased complaints. The Board investigated 13 complaints during 2011 and 2012 combined; in 2013, there were 12 investigations; in 2014, there were 14 investigations; and there have been 9 investigations opened in just the first quarter of this year. While many of the complaints that the Board investigated fortunately resulted in a finding of no probable cause, extensive hours and resources were nonetheless expended on the part of Board members assigned to investigation committees, the Board staff, and the Board attorney to arrive at those conclusions. We strive to ensure that each case is managed in a professional and sensitive manner. When there is a finding of no probable cause for Board action, we share the relief of the defending licensee. When there is probable cause for Board action, we are hopeful that we can provide education and corrective action through consent decrees. When such option is not possible, we will pursue the case as far as we have to in order to achieve justice - including the State Supreme Court - and to uphold our primary duty to protect the public.

The ABEP has also had the opportunity to use case complaints as a means to leverage other agencies for positive change. For example, after following through on a consumer complaint filed against a non-psychologist presenting themselves as such, we discovered that there are instances of agencies employing non-psychologists to provide psychological services by granting practice privileges and contracts to those individuals. This situation allowed the Board an opportunity to educate the agency in question, and ultimately other state agencies, about the importance of employing only licensed psychologists to provide psychological services to the vulnerable public. The functions of a regulatory Board are not easily replicated and cannot be replaced.

We have 58 new licensees this year, which is generally consistent with the past 4 years I have served on the Board (range 52-69). Approximately half of all licensees live outside of Alabama. These "non-natives", if you will, are usually active military personnel, or work for the VA or other Federal agencies. Given our commitment to those who serve our country, the Board is happy to be able to ensure that our active duty and veteran military personnel

are receiving quality psychological services provided by duly licensed individuals. The total number of psychologists and psychological technicians licensed in the State of Alabama is over 1,100 and paperwork must be processed for each and every one of them each year.

In addition to reviewing complaints and applications for licenses, the Board has spent many hours upgrading our ability to serve via our new website (psychology.alabama.gov), reviewing and, if necessary, updating language in the licensing law and administrative code, and working as closely as allowed with your primary professional organization, the Alabama Psychological Association (aPA). We have developed stronger relationships with Alabama legislators and, along with aPA, have provided commentary regarding proposed Bills that may impact the practice and regulation of psychology in Alabama. We continue to strengthen our relationship with the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) in order to keep you apprised of national trends such as the telepsychology, growth of applied behavioral analysis, and the current APA review of record keeping guidelines.

A few changes this year have led to a long overdue increase in fees to reflect the increased costs of running the Board. Updates to the Board's licensing law that became effective in 2014 demanded new and extra resources. A part of this will be the mandate to perform background checks on all applicants - a change I am sure we all support, but one that is not provided without expending additional resources. Updates to technology demand resources. Another change has been the expansion of the Board to include one additional member. While this is not a change we sought, the end result is positive in that we have increased representation of professional psychology on the board and extra hands to help manage the increased workflow.

Finally, let me thank all of you for your support through the past 4 years and the year to come. The closer working relationship between aPA and ABEP has been very positive for me personally and I look forward to continued collaboration, when necessary and as appropriate. I hope to continue the tradition of a professional, sensitive, respectful, and efficient ABEP.

#### **CONTINUING EDUCATION**

The Office Staff requests that you please report your Continuing Education hours as they are completed and accrued throughout the year. The Individual Reporting Form that must accompany a licensee's certificate of completion and the Continuing Education rules and regulations can be found on Board's web site at psychology.alabama.gov.

The C.E. requirement for psychologists is twenty (20) hours per year, unless specifically instructed otherwise by Board Order.

The requirement for psychological technicians is ten (10) hours per year, unless specifically instructed otherwise by Board Order.

#### ANNUAL LICENSE RENEWAL

*Please be advised:* Failure to comply with ALL requirements for annual license renewal by October 15 shall result in a **lapsed license**. Failure to renew a license prior to October 15 will not deprive a licensee of the right to renew his or her license, **but it does** *prohibit the individual from continuing to practice* unless he or she is working in an exempt setting.

A person who fails to renew a lapsed license within a period of two years is not eligible for reinstatement (i.e. the license will not be restored or reissued by the Board). Instead, a new application for licensure must be submitted and the applicant will be required to meet the statutory requirements for licensure in existence at the time of re-application.

Please contact the Board office for information on reinstating a lapsed license.
