<u>MEMBER APPOINTED TO THE BOARD</u> by Governor Robert Bentley

Former Chair Joseph D. Ackerson, Ph.D. was appointed again to serve a five-year term on the Board.

<u>CHAIR'S ADDRESS</u> from Mary Ann Bowers, Ph.D.

It is an honor to serve on the Board alongside professional and dedicated colleagues. Board Members Joseph D. Ackerson, Ph.D., Catalina M. Arata, Ph.D., La'Shonda A. Moore Kille, DPM (Public Member), Kristi A. Miller, M.S. (Psychological Technician Member), Martin L. Rohling, Ph.D., Kristin R. Tubre, Psy.D., and Carol P. Walker, Ph.D., ABPP are Governor appointees who volunteer their time and expertise. Lori Rall and Joya Burge, the Board's administrative staff, are the people you correspond with and who we are to thank for running a smooth and efficient Board Office. The Board's Attorney, Matt Beam, continues to provide calm and competent legal expertise. This is genuinely a dedicated group of people who work tirelessly to ensure that we undergo informed critical decision processes.

Again, the Board is having a busy year. The Alabama Psychological Association (aPA) began a process several years ago to update the Law governing Psychology in Alabama. After many years of hard work, in collaboration and concurrence with the Board, a Bill passed in the 2013 Legislative Session as Act No. 2013-386. This year's Bill (SB240/HB352) passed as Act No. 2016-416; it is a technical amendment to the Law which completes the work that the aPA began those few years ago. Executive Director Lori Rall and Board Counsel Matt Beam spent tireless hours in the State House to make sure that the Bills kept moving in both houses of the Legislature. Those to whom we owe thanks include members of the aPA's Executive Committee, Senator Cam Ward - Senate Sponsor, **Representative Patricia Todd** - House Sponsor, House Representative Howard Sanderford, and House Representative Jack Williams. This was truly a group effort.

This year's Act removes some outdated language. It allows the Board to set and amend fees, and require that licensure applicants submit to Federal and State Criminal History background checks. Soon applicants will be required to complete fingerprint cards which will allow the Board to access criminal history background information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency. The Board sees this as an opportunity to apply an extra layer of protection in the process of certifying that licensees provide safe and competent services.

As is regularly required of all State agencies, the Board met with the Joint Legislative Sunset Committee in October, 2015 following its audit of the Agency. The Sunset *Committee works by setting a date on which an agency is* ended unless the Legislature passes a Bill to continue it. Agencies are evaluated and then recommendations for positive changes may be issued. The Committee considers various recommendations and hears public testimony to decide on a package of recommendations to bring to the full Legislature for continuation of agency function. Then-Chair Dr. Ackerson made a presentation before the *Committee and answered questions regarding the practice* of psychology and the application of psychology to critical societal issues in Alabama and the nation. Board Member Dr. Rohling answered Committee queries about psychology training programs in the State and the percentage of licensure candidates from these programs who pass requisite competence examinations. The *Committee Legislators were very interested in the Board's* activities and about the Psychologists and Psychological Technicians licensed by the Board in Alabama, and determined that the agency will continue to function through its next Sunset review in 2020.

This year, Dr. Moore Kille, the Board's Public Member, attended the Midyear Meeting of the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) in Anchorage, Alaska. The Board is a jurisdictional member of the ASPPB that typically sends a member to each of its meetings to keep abreast of pertinent regulatory issues and to network with board members from the US and Canada. At this meeting, "Pitfalls of Social Media" was the topic addressed with the caveat that conduct, not speech, is being regulated. Another area of focus was the evolution of the EPPP to soon include a practical section which will be known as the EPPP Step 2. For more information, view Dr. Stephen T. As Board members, we have the privilege and responsibility to protect the potentially vulnerable public. As you know, the Board receives and investigates complaints against licensed psychologists and psychological technicians. The Board attempts to proceed with investigations in a timely yet thorough manner. We do not make decisions lightly and, in many instances, volunteer consultants from the aPA serve as expert consultants. Many investigations result in a no probable cause finding and are closed as confidential files. When probable cause is the determination, the Board works conscientiously with psychologists and psychological technicians to resolve the matter in an educative and compassionate manner. Decisions are always made with due consideration of Laws, Administrative Codes and Codes of Ethics.

Filed Certification: July 11, 2016 *Effective Date:* August 25, 2016

750-X-1-.01 Membership: This amendment was needed to assure that board membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural and economic diversity of the state without regard to political affiliation.

750-X-1-.08 Alabama Sunset Law: This amendment was needed to reflect the new termination date of October 1, 2020.

750-X-2-.03 Application Form: This amendment was needed to reflect a name change from the Alabama Bureau of Investigation to the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (re: criminal history background checks).

750-X-2A-.02 Application Deadlines: This amendment was needed to remove a requirement for completion of a computer-based-testing application which is no longer used.

750-X-2A-.03 Application Form: This amendment was needed to reflect a name change from the Alabama Bureau of Investigation to the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (re: criminal history background checks).

750-X-2A-.04 Psychological Technician Training Requirements: This amendment was needed to remove outdated language.

750-X-3-.03 Reexamination: This amendment was needed because it is no longer necessary to submit requests for reexamination in writing.

750-X-4-.02 Inactive Status: This amendment was needed to reflect the requirement for payment of an annual inactive status fee.

compliance with The General Guidelines for Providers of Psychological Services, which are outdated. **750-X-6-.03 American Psychological Association General Guidelines For Providers of Psychological Services, 1987 Edition (Appendix III):** This repeal was needed to remove The General Guidelines for Providers of Psychological Services, which are outdated.

750-X-3-.01 Written Examination: This amendment is needed because The General Guidelines for Providers of Psychological Services are outdated and are no longer included in the Professional Standards Examination (PSE).

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Please submit your Continuing Education reporting as you complete and accrue hours throughout the year. The Individual Reporting Form that accompanies the certificate of completion and C.E. rules and regulations can be found at Board's web site at psychology.alabama.gov.

The C.E. requirements (unless specifically instructed otherwise by Board Action or Order): **Psychologists -** twenty (20) hours per year. **Psychological Technicians -** ten (10) hours per year.

ANNUAL LICENSE RENEWAL

Please be advised: Failure to comply with ALL requirements for annual license renewal by October 15 shall result in a lapsed license. While not renewing a license prior to October 15 does not deprive a licensee of the right to renew the license, *it does prohibit the individual from continuing to practice* unless he or she is working in an exempt setting.

A person who fails to renew a lapsed license within a period of two (2) years is not eligible for reinstatement (i.e. the license will not be restored or reissued by the Board). Instead, a new application for licensure must be submitted and the applicant will be required to meet the statutory requirements for licensure in existence at the time of re-application.

Please contact the Board Office for information on reinstating a lapsed license.

ADDRESSING ADDRESSES: The Board Office compiles the Roster of licensees containing mailing addresses of record on file with the Board. A licensee's address of record is available to the public upon request. A licensee's address of record is where license renewal forms and other official Board communications are mailed. This year's license renewal forms will ask licensees to provide a Home Address and a Business Address, and to designate which should be used as the public address of record. If you wish to change your address of record, please contact the Board Office.

From time to time, the Board Office sends unofficial yet important communications to licensees via email. It is essential that you provide your email address on your Renewal Form and it is necessary for you to promptly update the Board when you have changes to your email address. Email addresses are not included in the information published in the Roster of licensees. If you need to change your email address during the licensure year, please contact the Board Office.
