CHAIR'S ADDRESS by Tom Boll, Ph.D., ABPP

The Alabama Board of Examiners in Psychology has had a very busy year addressing a diversity of topics. First and most importantly we welcomed a new Executive Director - Lori Rall - upon the retirement of our longtime colleague Kathy Cawood. Lori has taken up very actively and professionally a myriad of duties of the usual sort related to the complex undertakings of the Board. Additionally, she has been an active participant in our renewed relationship with the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards which is exceedingly positive. She has attended two of their national meetings and has benefitted well from the topics that were discussed which are of national significance and have direct import in the state of Alabama as we relate to how it is that other licensing boards carry out related activities. These activities include managing tele-health, dealing with psychologists who visit Alabama on a temporary basis from other states, continuing education requirements, and employing background checks for applicants, among others. These are all active topics of consideration and discussion among Board members and Lori's sophistication and level of knowledge and active participation in these discussions is critical to all of us. We are delighted to have her on board and have been very fortunate to have her be willing to join us in this undertaking.

We are also very fortunate that our longtime colleague Joya Burge continues in her position and represents a high level of competence, stability and knowledge and brings a history of the organization that is absolutely invaluable. We are very fortunate to have these two very fine individuals. I have been licensed in 11 states and have had business activities with at least that many more. In that context I can tell each of you that our Board is very well-served by our administrative staff. The protection of the public, which is our primary responsibility, is in very good hands.

We have also been very actively involved with the Alabama Psychological Association, to the extent that it is appropriate for the Board to do so, in their efforts to improve the state's licensing law. We have obviously run into some difficulties of a political nature which will not be explored here.

Nevertheless, it is important to point out that under the leadership of Linda Alverson-Eiland, Ph.D. and Gaye Vance, Ph.D., among others, and with the very active participation from our Board members, especially Joe Ackerson, Ph.D., ABPP, a very good set of changes, modernizations and streamlining has been accomplished and is currently being considered at the Legislative level. It would certainly be to all of our benefit to have such an improvement in the law. Whether or not it is possible to accomplish this is more of a political than a content-based reality. All of you will be kept apprised of that by the Alabama Psychological Association, which has worked exceedingly hard for more than a year on this important task.

Disciplinary action is something that everybody is concerned about with regard to their relationship with any licensing board, ours included. For that reason, a little information about the Board's disciplinary process is helpful as there is much misinformation that seems to float about. This is probably anxiety-driven and understandable but nevertheless is not helpful. The primary role of the *Alabama Board of Examiners* in Psychology and the licensing law is protection of the public, not protection of psychologists or enhancement of their practice. In that context, disciplinary issues are raised. In the last two years, the Board received twenty two complaints to be considered. Of those, six had sufficient merit to rise to the level of probable cause and to be pursued further with regard to the possibility of a hearing or other disciplinary-related actions. Each complaint was very carefully reviewed by the Board investigative Committee, including Board members and our very capable and specifically experienced attorney, Matt Beam. In several instances, an outside contracted Expert was consulted for review, as well.

The majority of these cases, 73%, were found to not rise to the level of probable cause. This indicates that, while a fair number of complaints are raised, most do not have sufficient merit to warrant taking action against a licensee. Even though these determinations take time in order for careful review to be undertaken, the general experience in the psychology community is that only those circumstances which pass multiple sieves of evaluation go on to probable cause. That should be a reassurance to the public to know that each of their complaints is given exceptionally careful scrutiny. It should also be a reassurance to the public to know that in the vast majority of cases psychologists are performing ethically and appropriately. While a complaint may reflect a genuine dissatisfaction with one aspect of a consumer's interaction with a psychologist, it sometimes does not reflect a violation of our ethics or levels of professional standards or licensing law.

The Alabama Board of Examiners in Psychology is comprised of an excellent group of individuals including Pam Snyder, Ph.D., Joe Ackerson, Ph.D., ABPP, Mary Bowers, Ph.D., Clara Gerhardt, Ph.D. (Past-Chair), Joe Taylor, M.S.-Psychological Technician and Chacolby Burns-Johnson-Public Member. Our Board continues to seek good nominees and to try to diversify our representation, especially geographically and with regard to male/female distribution. We currently have no members from the southern regions of the state ranging from Enterprise and Dothan all the way to Mobile. We do have representatives from Montgomery, Birmingham and the Shoals area. It is our hope that individuals from those unrepresented areas will make themselves available to the Alabama Psychological Association, which makes the Board member nominations that are presented to the Governor for appointment.

It is a pleasure to serve on the Board in this my fourth year. It is not a position that requires an inordinate amount of work, but it bears a very significant responsibility which is felt by and taken seriously by each and every Board member. The Board is very appreciative of the participation of the Alabama Psychological Association and very much welcomes the participation of other members in our open meetings. It is a great honor to serve as Chair this year and I look forward to continuing service throughout my term.
