OLD BUSINESS:

- Preparing for Emergency Practice in response to a declared disaster Language added to our website. Update. Governor's Extension of Emergency per May 8, 2020 Proclamation, extending State of Emergency for another sixty (60) days. Motion by Dr. Ackerson I make a motion that we extend the temporary practice to psychologists that are licensed in states other than Alabama consistent with the emergency declaration issued by Governor Ivey. Seconded by Cook. Motion passed.
- 2020 Legislative Session SB21, relating to the Alabama Sunset Law, to continue the existence and functioning of the Alabama Board of Examiners in Psychology until October 1, 2024. Sponsored by Senator Chambliss following Sunset Audit in the last Fiscal Year. Enrolled and enacted Assigned Act No. 2020-46, continuing the existence and functioning of the Alabama Board of Examiners in Psychology until October 1, 2024.
- 2020 Legislative Session SB61, Relating to PSYPACT and a Wellness and Monitoring Program. Sponsored by Senator Andrew Jones. Last action, March 12, 2020 Reported from Senate Healthcare committee as Favorable with one Substitute; Engrossed in the Senate with one Substitute; and, Read for the first time and referred to the House of Representatives committee on Health.

NEW BUSINESS:

1) Continuing Education courses completed online during COVID-19. Motion by Arata: Regarding Continuing Education directly related to the practice of psychology during the COVID-19 State of Emergency, I move that the Board allow licensed Psychologist and Psychological Technicians to complete 50% of their Continuing Education requirements for the 2019-2020 Licensure Year in alternative formats, to include unaccredited programs, to be reviewed and approved by the Board and its Executive Staff. Seconded by Ackerson. Motion passed.
