### **REVIEW OF MINUTES:**

Review of the July 9, 2021 Minutes. Motion by Cook: I move to approve the Minutes. Seconded by Miller. Motion passed.

# **OLD BUSINESS**:

- Preparing for emergency practice in response to a declared Public Health disaster New State of Emergency Proclamation by Governor Ivey, issued August 13, 2021. Sixty (60) Psychologists have registered for Emergency Practice under this proclamation; five (5) previously registered Psychologists declined to register again due to Alabama becoming a participating Compact State with PSYPACT. Additionally, Governor Ivey issued a supplemental natural disaster State of Emergency Proclamation related to Hurricane Ida on August 28, 2021; two (2) Psychologists have registered for Emergency Practice with this proclamation.
- 2) Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (PSYPACT) Act 2021-116 to be effective June 1, 2021, Commissioner Lori Rall. Officially accepted, effective August 5, 2021, by majority vote at Commission Meeting. Commission's Annual Meeting November 18, 2021. Ms. Rall serves on the Training and Public Relations Committee and was named Chair at the September 9, 2021 meeting. Review of PSYPACT Commission Newsletter, July 2021, Volume 2, Issue 3.
- 3) Alabama Psychology Professionals Wellness Committee Act 2021-283, effective January 1, 2022. Rules Committee met on August 6, 2021; Edwin W. Cook, III, Ph.D. was

- identified as Committee Chair. New Administrative Code Chapter 750-X-5A. Notice of Intended Action to be published in the <u>Alabama Administrative Monthly</u>, September 2021. Motion by Bowers: I make a motion to accept and post the Rules. Seconded by Arata. Motion passed.

Garver, DMD Wellness and Monitoring Program management associated with current and ongoing participants and the business of the upcoming Alabama Psychology Professionals Wellness Committee, period of December 2021 December 2023. Motion by Berland: I move that we offer the Contract as is. Seconded by Bowers. Motion passed.
- Proposed update to Administrative Code Rule Chapter 750-X-3A-.05 <u>Definition of Continuing Education Activity</u>. Notice of Intended Action to be published the <u>Alabama Administrative Monthly</u> in September 2021. Review. Motion by Miller: I move that we accept the changes and approve the posting fees. Seconded by Bowers. Motion passed.
- 4) Proposed update to Administrative Code Rule Chapter 750-X-6-.02. American Psychological Association Ethical Principles of Psychologists and Code Of Conduct. Notice of Intended Action to be published in the Alabama Administrative Monthly in September 2021. Review. Motion by Miller: I move that we approve the proposed changes to the Administrative Code Rule Chapter 750-X-6-.02. Seconded by Berland. Motion passed. Dr. Cook suggested that the language we adopt should also include any preceding version or versions published thereafter by the American Psychological Association.
- American Psychological Association (APA) Town Hall Meeting, July 12, 2021 Commission on Accreditation, discussion on standards of accreditation for Master's Programs: Competencies in the Standards of Accreditation for Master's Programs in Health Service Psychology. Lori Rall attended. Ms. Rall suggested that, while the APA has released little or no guidance for regulatory agencies about licensing master's-level psychology professionals, the Board should plan to update Administrative Code Rules on Psychological Technician education and training requirements to reflect the most modern national standards of competency for master's-level professionals. There was additional discussion about the Board engaging the Alabama Psychological Association (aPA) to

begin collecting public opinion/comment on master's-level psychological practice and licensure, specifically about potentially broadening the scope services a licensed Psychological Technician can provide to reflect educational updates, areas of competence, and limits of practice, and to meet needs in Alabama.
